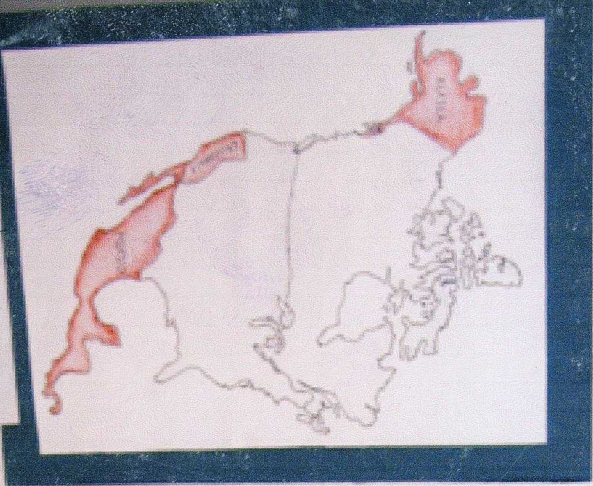
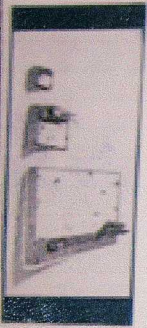


# THE ECOLOGICAL FOOTPRINT OF TRANSPORTATION



The ecological footprint of transportation is the total area of land and water required to produce the energy and materials used in the transportation system. This footprint is calculated by multiplying the amount of energy and materials used by the amount of land and water required to produce each unit of energy and material. The total ecological footprint of transportation is the sum of the ecological footprints of all transportation modes.



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
